Republic Airways Reports a 45% increase in March 2006 Traffic

Company Carries Over One Million Passengers in the Month for the First Time

Indianapolis, Indiana, (April 10, 2006) – Republic Airways Holdings (NASDAQ/NM: RJET), today reported preliminary passenger traffic results for March 2006. The company generated 540 million revenue passenger miles (RPMs), a 45.3% increase over the same month last year, while available seat miles (ASMs) increased to 711.7 million, a 38.9% increase. Block hours were 43,977 in March 2006, a 13.4% increase over March 2005. Load factor was 75.9% versus 72.6% in March 2005. A total of 1,026,365 passengers were carried during the month, a 32.1% increase over the same month last year. This is the first time Republic Airways has reported over One million passengers in a single month.
